*Opening Doors For Youth Experiencing
Homelessness*

Young people through the age of 24 make up about one-third of all persons experiencing homelessness. Providers in integrated care settings can play an important role as seeking health care can be a young person's first step to leaving the street. Youth experiencing homelessness have a complex array of medical, behavioral and social problems that benefit from the skills of staff working in integrated care sites. Visits for clinical care offer providers a window of opportunity to address the immediate needs of youth experiencing homelessness and to work on long term goals in settings youth consider safe and trustworthy.

The BHC is an active primary care team member whose goal is to improve patient functioning, assist with the implementation of the primary care provider (PCP) treatment plans and support patients in achieving improved health outcomes. This includes, but is not limited to, assessment of needs and barriers to health, treatment planning, adherence counseling, lifestyle modification, referral to internal and external resources, patient psycho-education, treatment plan follow-up, relapse prevention planning, discharge planning and crisis management. The BHC will be housed in the medical clinic and will work hours that coincide with the hours of clinic operation.</p> <p>Full Job Descriptions</p>
