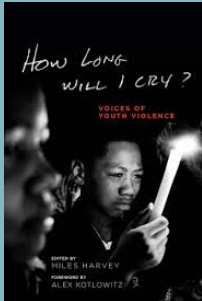
Pediatric Advocacy Symposium
