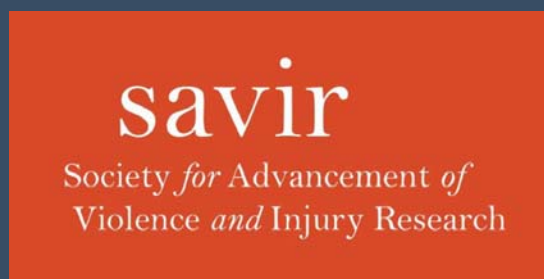

Youth Advocate Program

The Safely Home Campaign is a collaborative approach to bringing youth safely home from out-of-home placements led by [Youth Advocate Program \(YAP\)](#).

[Safely Home](#) describes how communities and systems can safely support high-need youth in their homes and communities, focusing on the elements of effective community-based alternatives for high and complex need youth in the juvenile justice system.



2011 Fatality Data Available

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

The Web-based Injury Statistics Query and Reporting System ([WISQARS](#)) is an interactive, online database that provides fatal and nonfatal injury data from a variety of sources. Researchers, practitioners, the media, and the general public can use WISQARS data to learn more about the public health and economic burden of injury in the United States. Users can search, sort, and view the injury data and create reports, charts, maps, and slides.



CDC has recently updated WISQARS to include 2011 data from the National Vital Statistics System. These data are now available in the following WISQARS modules: Fatal Injury Reports, Leading Causes of Death, and Years of Potential Life Lost (YPLL).
