COALITION ON POST-INCARCERATION HEALTH

For African Americans with Mental Illness

Researchers at the Illinois Institute of Technology's [Chicago Health Disparities Center](#), in partnership with Trilogy Behavioral Healthcare and the Safer Foundation, are forming a coalition to prioritize the healthcare needs of African Americans with mental illness who are transitioning from incarceration. The coalition, funded through Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute, will meet monthly over the next two years, and will include both patients and stakeholders (service providers, family members, policymakers, etc).
