### What is Mental Health First Aid?

Youth Mental Health First Aid is an 8-hour public education program which introduces participants to the risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems in adolescents, builds understanding of the importance of early intervention, and teaches how to help an adolescent in crisis or experiencing a mental health challenge. Mental Health First Aid uses role-playing and simulations to demonstrate how to assess a mental health crisis; select interventions and provide initial help; and connect young people to professional, peer, social, and self-help care.

## VOICES OF CHILD HEALTH IN CHICAGO REPORT

### Parent Concerns about Bullying and Cyberbullying

The most recent report from Voices of Child Health in Chicago has been released with Highlights include the following: mothers were more likely than fathers to express concerns about bullying; Latinx parents were the most concerned about bullying; and parents who considered bullying a big problem were also likely to consider other mental health issues big problems, such as drug abuse, depression, stress, social media, suicide and alcohol abuse.
