For the last several years, a number of SCY partners and staff have been extensively involved in Preventing Alcohol Abuse in Chicago Teens, a coalition convened by Lurie Children's. This month begins a 3-month planning period to bring our substance use prevention work under the SCY umbrella, expand to address all youth substance use prevention, and center the voices of young people. These changes reflect the connection between violence and substance use, including the effectiveness of positive youth development in prevention efforts. ## RISKING CONNECTION IN FAITH COMMUNITIES

### Fostering Resilience, Health and Hope in Our Congregations and Communities
