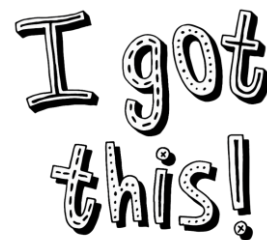

VOICES OF CHILD HEALTH IN CHICAGO REPORT

Food access, Parents' Nutrition and Challenges to Healthy Eating for Kids

Voices of Child Health in Chicago has released the second report in a two-part series on challenges to healthy eating for kids. Some report highlights include: 4 in ten Chicago parents live in a community area with limited food access; parents who live in community areas with limited food access were more likely to report challenges to healthy eating for children; and parents who had unhealthy eating habits themselves were more likely to report challenges to healthy eating for their children.
