

While the ACS produces sample-based population group and housing estimates used in this report, the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program produces and disseminates official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns, as well as estimates of housing units for states and counties. 

#### Households and Families

In 2012-2016 there were 4.8 million households in Illinois. The average household size was 2.6 people.

Families made up 65 percent of the households in Illinois. This figure includes both married-couple families (48 percent) and other families (17 percent). Of other families, 7 percent are female householder families with no husband present and own children under 18 years. Nonfamily households made up 35 percent of all households in Illinois. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

In Illinois, 32 percent of all households have one or more people under the age of 18; 26 percent of all households have one or more people 65 years and over.



Among persons 15 and older, 50 percent of males and 46 percent of females are currently married.



In Illinois, 270,100 grandparents lived with their grandchildren under 18 years old. Of those grandparents, 33 percent of them had financial responsibility for their grandchildren.

#### Education

In 2012-2016, 88 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 33 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. An estimated 12 percent did not complete high school.

The total school enrollment in Illinois was 3.4 million in 2012-2018. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 308,700 and elementary or high school enrollment was 2 million children. College or graduate school enrollment was 940,200.



#### Disability


In Illinois, among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in 2012-2016, 11 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 3 percent of people under 18 years old, to 9 percent of people 18 to 64 years old, and to 35 percent of those 65 and over.



#### ▶ Income

The median income of households in Illinois was \$59,196. An estimated 12 percent of households had income below \$15,000 a year and 12 percent had income over \$150,000 or more.




An estimated 79 percent of the households received earnings and 17 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. An estimated 28 percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$18,313. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.
