FEATURED ARTICLE: VOICES OF CHILD HEALTH IN CHICAGO REPORT

Child Vision Testing in Chicago

In the latest Voices of Child Health in Chicago Report, they examined child and adolescent vision health in Chicago. Report highlights include: 76% of Chicago children at least 1 year old have had their vision tested with pictures, shapes and letters; the two most common places where children had their vision tested was an eye doctor or eye specialist (62%) and at school (27%); younger children were less likely to have had their vision tested than older children.
