The COVID-19 pandemic continues to impact families in Chicago and across the country, with a recent national poll showing that 86% of the general public say the pandemic isn't yet over in the

United States. In this report, [Voices of Child Health in Chicago](#) examines parents' attitudes about requiring vaccines against COVID-19 in different contexts. Report highlights include: more than half of Chicago parents (55%) agreed that schools should be able to mandate COVID-19 vaccines for children to attend school in person, and 56% agreed that employers should be able to mandate COVID-19

vaccines.
