UNSAFE CAR SEAT PRACTICES IN CHICAGO

Voices of Child Health in Chicago

Car crashes remain a leading cause of death and severe injury for children 1 to 10 years old in the United States. <u>Voices of Child Health in Chicago</u> has released its latest report about unsafe car practices in Chicago. Some of the report highlights include:



Voices of Child Health in Chicago

- The majority of Chicago parents reported engaging in at least one unsafe car seat practice
- It is critical that parents and other caregivers secure the top tether every time they install a forward-facing car seat
- It is essential to remove bulky clothing such as coats and snowsuits before placing a child in a car seat so that the straps are snug enough to protect from injury in a crash
